How Are We One-Anothering One Another?

There are nearly 60 "One-Another" statements in the New Testament. The plethora of statements gives us an obvious inside look at God's heart for His church. It shows us that God designed us to be connected in a way that is healthy and helpful in our spiritual growth. We were created as relational beings in the image of a relational God. As the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit relate to one another in



perfect harmony and unity,
God made us to relate to
one another. This is
especially true of the church,
which He had the Apostle
Paul describe as a body.
This body may have many
parts, but it is still one body.
So, we are called into
one-anothering! What does
that look like? Let me offer a
few thoughts about what this

may look like in a practical way. First, the New Testament tells us to Love One-Another more often than any other statement. Romans 12 tells us to the devoted to one-another in brotherly love. This statement seems to be very broad and perhaps serves as an umbrella phrase for other one-another statements. Gal. 5:13 tells us to Serve One-Another in love. This demands that we make it our business to be aware of others around us and seek to help them in whatever need they may have. Sometimes serving one-another is just an act that says I care about you, so let me wash your feet. You have a great opportunity to really practice this kind of care and servanthood through Life Groups. Who in your Life Group needs to know that they are loved and belong to the body? Hebrews 10:25 tells us to Encourage One-Another. We are in this together! As much as we may struggle each day to faithfully follow the Lord, our brother or sister in Christ needs your encouragement. We enter into their struggle to faithfully follow Christ and carry each other's burdens (Gal. 6:2). Practicing the one-anothers is something we do intentionally. Who in your Life Group or D-Group needs you to send them a word of encouragement? That encouragement could be as simple as a timely word or a listening ear. Maybe that encouragement is taking a minute or two and praying with that person. There are many One-Another statements, but perhaps it would be good to just focus on these two for a moment. Let me challenge you to ask yourself these two questions:

> Who in my life can I serve to help ease their burden? Who in my life needs to be encouraged in their walk with Jesus?

"Therefore, be imitators of God, as dearly loved children"
— Ephesians 5:1

We read our Bibles in order to meet with God. What is printed on those pages is not merely words, sentences, and paragraphs, but the very words of God. Without Scripture, we would not have any saving knowledge of God. But by his Word, God gives us everything we need for life and godliness. Scripture is not simply words about God. In it we hear *God's own words*, words from his own mouth testifying to who he is and what he has done. Therefore, we do not read our Bibles to learn about God. We read our Bibles in order to meet with God.

God does not reveal himself solely in order to give us facts. He reveals himself in order to create a relationship. He reveals himself so that we might obey him. The demons hate God while having superb doctrine (James 2:19). Similarly, Jesus condemns many Jews for knowing



the Scriptures and yet rejecting the One to whom all Scripture points (John 5:39-40). We cannot make the subtle but dangerous mistake of confusing intrigue about the Bible with knowing God himself. We cannot be content knowing about God.

All of this requires faith. We must be convinced that in the words printed on the pages of our Bibles God speaks. But when we submit to those words as the Word of God, the Word of our living Lord and our risen King, the Spirit will confirm that God is alive and active through his Word. This is a reality that takes place not only in the mind but in the heart. Only once it is established in our hearts does the Word of God become a force that transforms us. John Calvin put it this way, "For the Word of God is not received by faith if it flits about in the top of the brain, but when it takes root in the depth of the heart that it may be an invincible defense to withstand and drive off all the stratagems of temptation." We know we have met with God when his Word becomes our secure hope in the face of life's difficulties.

At FBC, we believe God wants us to know him, and we believe this happens only through hearing and reading Scripture. Perhaps you have never experienced Scripture in this way. I would encourage you to pick up a reading plan and schedule daily time to meet with God. Or better yet, join a D-Group, which will provide accountability to encourage you to spend time hearing from God.

I hope that if you've been a Christian for some time, this sort of experience describes your regular communion with God. Would you be willing to disciple others and help them come to know God through his Word as you have? Consider starting a D-Group and help others to meet with God regularly through his Word.

FBC Youth

Ignited by Change - Fueled by Faith - Led by Passion

Hello church family,

"What is our only hope in life and death?" "What is God?" "How many persons are there in God?" "How and why did God create us?" These are all central questions to our Christian faith, and these questions have been the basis for our youth group since the beginning of the year. During the Fall of 2018, the youth leaders reviewed what we had been doing as a youth group. We determined there were some ways that we could improve what we do as a student ministry in order to focus more on discipleship. We implemented this change beginning in January. Our



curriculum consists of 52 questions and answers that will guide us through the fundamentals of the Christian faith. These questions and answers are adapted from classic Protestant catechisms and confessions. This material has been published under the title *The New City Catechism* by Crossway and The Gospel Coalition.

We plan to focus on one or two questions a month and spend the entire month teaching, discussing, and applying that theme. Our goal is that every student who consistently comes to our youth group will be exposed to the central tenets of the Christian faith and understand how these doctrines affect their everyday lives. Each month we will introduce the question(s) for the month with a formal time of teaching. On the second week of the month, the students will study a passage of Scripture that relate to that doctrine in their small group. During the third week of the month, we will have a large group discussion on how what we've looked at throughout the month affects our everyday lives. I expect that this new format will help our students grow in Christ.
