Celebrating Easter by Going!

The first step in making disciples is to go... Matthew 28:19 says, "Therefore, go and make disciples..." Going implies that a mission that has been given to the church. This mission is described in a parallel

account as becoming witnesses of Christ to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8). It is always the right time to invite others to come with you to a worship service, but this is especially true on Easter. It will be a time of celebration as we rest our hope in the resurrected Jesus, who is alive today and waiting for the time when the Father tells Him to go get His bride (the Church). I want to challenge you to make this Easter a time where you do more than



just celebrate, but you engage in mission. Here is what I am challenging you to do:

EASTER CHALLENGE

- 1. Ask God to lay three people on your heart that you can invite to one of our Easter services.
- 2. Write the names of those three people down and make a point to pray for them.
- 3. Invite them to come join you in whatever service you are attending.
- 4. Give them an invitation card (provided at the welcome center) as a reminder.

The Book of Hebrews has been describing to us the beauty of the Gospel as well as a call to endure in faith. In April and May, we will be exploring chapter 11 (the faith chapter), and discovering that the life we are called to live is one of faith in the power, presence, and promises of God. For many, inviting people to come with them to church will be a huge act of faith, but I believe it is worth the risk. We have been rescued by Jesus and have now been entrusted with the Good News of the Gospel. That in and of itself should be motive enough to take this challenge, but let me offer two more. First, it is a tangible way to show to others that you care about their soul. Finally, joy will be the result of engaging God's mission. So what do you say? Are you ready to engage? Will you take the challenge?

This workshop is for parents who are interested in dedicating themselves to raising their children in a Godly home. We will look at what is the dedication process and why we choose to dedicate parents and children. "Therefore, be imitators of God, as dearly loved children"
— Ephesians 5:1

God is clear: his people must "do justice" (Micah 6:8). Certainly, we could add to that list. But it would be dangerous for us to minimize or neglect the importance of justice. What then is "justice"? Although the term is used in a variety of contexts, one of the primary meanings of the word refers to someone's legal claim or to what is due to them. It exists when people are treated fairly and without favoritism. To do justice is to give people what they deserve.

Doing justice is one God's defining qualities: "For the LORD your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great, the mighty, and the awesome God, who is not partial and takes no bribe. He executes justice for the fatherless and the widow, and loves the sojourner, giving him food and



clothing" (Deut. 10:17-18). God does justice, but he has particular concern for the fatherless, the widow, and the sojourner. These people represent the most vulnerable in society, and therefore those who are most likely to suffer from injustice because they rarely have the resources to defend themselves. God is particularly concerned that the vulnerable are treated equitably.

As disciples, we are called to imitate God. We must also do justice. Ezekiel 18:5-9 describes a person who "does what is just and right." This person keeps God's laws. He does not worship idols. He does not commit adultery. He does not steal. But he also does something else: he "gives his bread to the hungry and covers the naked with a garment" (v. 7). He is *generous*. And God does not consider providing for the powerless and vulnerable simply an act of charity. It is justice. To do justice then is to leverage any power, position, or privilege we have in order to care for the vulnerable.

But our natural tendency is precisely the opposite. We use our power and privilege to make sure we and our families are safe and comfortable. But justice requires that we leverage these things not for ourselves but for others. Perhaps we may even have to give them up. But we can't. We won't. How then can we become people who do justice? Deuteronomy 10 provides the answer. In vv. 17-18, God calls himself the great, awesome God, who executes justice. He commands his people to do the same "for you were sojourners in the land of Egypt" (v. 19).

The only motivation for true justice is the gospel. We will be just people only when we are amazed by what Jesus did for us. He gave up his power, position, and privilege as the Son of God and took the place of rebellious sinners on the cross. Jesus loved the weak, the vulnerable, the powerless. If we do not see ourselves as weak, vulnerable, and powerless because of sin, we cannot accept the gospel. But when we do accept the gospel, we must be people who care for the vulnerable. Then we will be doing what God requires of us: justice.

This week as he was making a hospital call he tripped over a half inch curb that he didn't see. He fell on the sidewalk injuring both wrists, a knee, and damaging some cartilage in his rib-cage while trying to recover his

balance. Prayers for a quick and complete recovery and better depth perception.
