#### [ Dis · ci · ple ] "Therefore, be imitators of God, as dearly loved children" — Ephesians 5:1

We want every person in our church to find strong relational connection in genuine community. This is why we have Life Groups. Our Life Groups are intended to create strong relational connection. A Life Group is a place for a person to belong.

To belong requires two things: that I am loved and that I am valued. First, to be loved means that I am truly known by others. In fact, I am truly known even in my weakness and sin, and yet still loved and accepted. This is what Paul is getting at in many places in the New Testament when he commands his churches to forgive one another and to bear one another's burdens. If I am loved even when others truly know me, then I have found a place where I belong.



But to belong also requires that I am valued. To be valued means that others believe that God has gifted me in order to bless them. If I am valued, I can contribute. This is what the apostle Peter teaches us: God has given each of us a gift that we are expected to use to serve others. When I am valued, others see me as a gift to the community.

This could be said in another way: if I truly belong, it is clear when I'm not there; I am missed. When I am valued, my absence creates a hole. So if I can contribute and if I am missed when I am gone, then I have found a place where I belong.

We cannot be a disciple of Jesus by ourselves. That is why God has saved us into a community, his Church. Our vision for Life Groups is for every person in our church to find strong relational connection in genuine community. This means that they can find a place to belong. This means that every person is loved and valued for who they are in Christ.

Life Groups are a critical part of our Discipleship Pathway because they provide the context in which our love for Jesus is manifested in love for others. We create a place for others to belong because we belong to Jesus. If he has done that for us, we too should go out of our way to seek out others and welcome them into our Life Groups. If you are not in a Life Group or don't join regularly, what is keeping you from being a blessing to others? If you are in a Life Group, how can you take one step to build stronger relationships with those in your group? Who hasn't been there for a while that you could reinvite with a simple phone call? Healthy Life Groups will grow only when we all seek to love and value one another.



I don't know about your family, but my family has several Christmas traditions. Traditions are special because they are unique to your own family and because they are peppered with memories of years past. Often, our traditions happen accidentally and organically. One year, we do something we enjoy and someone says, "Let's do this every year!" Sometimes, though, our traditions are more intentional. This Christmas, consider intentionally adding family traditions that point to Jesus. Here are a few ideas, stop by the Faith @ Home center for additional ideas and resources that you can use at home.

**CHRISTMAS DISCIPLESHIP GUIDE**: Grab a Family Discipleship Guide to use with your family throughout the weeks leading up to Christmas. The weekly focus goes along with what the kids are learning on Sunday mornings, but can be used by all families. The guide begins with the prophesied Messiah and then looks at how the prophecy was fulfilled when Jesus was born. The Messiah has come! We should need no other reason to celebrate.

**READ THE CHRISTMAS STORY:** This one may already be part of your Christmas celebration. Read the story of Jesus' birth from Luke 2. If you have small children, consider using a Children's Bible or a story book that tells the story. You could also act out the story, using yourself and your children as actors, or using your nativity set. Another fun interactive way to tell the story would be to have your children make sound effects. Remember to ask questions as you go along so your children will stay engaged and understand the story.

**PRAY FOR THE FAMILIES WHO SEND YOU CHRISTMAS CARDS:** When you receive a Christmas card in the mail, make a point to gather the family and pray for those who sent it. You might do this each night at dinner, or save up the cards for an allotted time during the week. You might ask each member of your family to pray for a different member of the family on the card.

**GIVE AS A FAMILY:** Along with opportunities to serve, Christmas also brings in an abundance of opportunities to give. Encourage your children to save up in order to give to others.

**SERVE OTHERS:** There are countless ways to serve others during the Christmas season. Head to a nursing home, a hospital waiting room, or a local homeless shelter. Bring gifts, sing carols, offer to pray for families, or serve food. Be sure to check with the management before you go to see what is most needed and most enjoyed.

**LISTEN TO CHRISTMAS MUSIC:** Christmas songs and carols are rich in theology. Your children may not realize it at the time, but they are learning lyrics that point to Jesus as the Hope of the world. Sing the songs as a family and as your children get older, consider going to a Christmas concert.

**ATTEND CHURCH SERVICE:** Church services during the Christmas season are a great time for children to learn the story of Jesus' birth and the hope of His second coming. Familiar Christmas carols are often sung and there's an opportunity to explain Christmas to curious little ones. The candlelight service, while nerve-wracking for parents, can point children to the Light of the world.

**FAITH @ HOME CENTER:** If your family would like more ideas or resources to help your family focus on Jesus birth -please stop by the Faith at Home Center. At the Faith at Home Center there are many resources to help your family focus your Christmas celebrations on the coming of the Messiah.

# **MISSIONARY CORNER**



Many of you may recognize Seth and Rebecca Mallay and their family. They were with us for our missions conference this last year and shared from their experience working in Togo. As the missions team discussed the conference and the 2020 budget for this year, we have recommended to the elders that we support the Mallay family as a partner church. We will be voting on this at the annual meeting on January 12th, 2020.

The Mallay family are in the pre-field stage as medical missionaries to West Africa through ABWE. Their mission is to know Christ and to make him known by multiplying leaders, churches, and missions movements through compassion and medical ministry in Togo.

Halfway through their two-year commitment to a hospital in Togo with Samaritan's Purse, they were forced to return to the United States after finding a tumor in the abdomen of their oldest daughter, Arwen. In January of 2018, Arwen was diagnosed with stage four neuroblastoma. While they continue to seek treatment for their daughter, they have begun their pre-field ministry with ABWE and hope to return to Togo again in a couple years.
