Sept. 11, 2022 – 1 Kings 11:1-13 Pastor Jon Pickens

Solomon started his reign well. (1 Kings 3:6-9, 1 Kings 4:24-25, 1 Kings 6-8, 1 Kings 10:23-24)

Solomon began to compromise his obedience to the Lord

- God's promise to Solomon:
 - 1 Kings 3:14; 1 Kings 6:11-13; 1 Kings 9:3-5
 - Solomon's promise: 1 Kings 8:23-25; 1 Kings 8:54-61
 - He ignored God's warning. 1 Kings 9:6-7; 1 Kings 11:1-2
- His compromised his walk of obedience.
 1 Kings 11:9-11

Solution: Walk **<u>faithfully</u>** before God.

Definition of Faithfulness: It is a committed pursuit of God through <u>obedience</u>, <u>repentance</u>, and sincere <u>love</u>.

Four Areas of Faithfulness to finish strong as a leader and as a church:

- 1. Faithful in our <u>Worship</u>: Committed to worshipping God alone.
- 2. Faithful in our **Walk**: Committed to pursuing obedience out of love.
- 3. Faithful to the **Church**: Committed to using the gifts God has given each of us to encourage, edify, and unify the body.
- 4. Faithful in **Mission**: Committed to being actively involved in advancing God's purposes for His world.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. At the beginning of Solomon's reign, he seems to be a mature and devoted man of God, yet he turned his heart toward other gods toward the end of his reign. How did that happen to Solomon? How can that happen to you?
- 2. What happened to Solomon seems to be a picture of what happened to Israel. They turned away from the LORD and turned to other gods. In what ways can this or has this happened to the church?
- 3. In what ways can we be guilty of compromising our obedience to Christ?
- 4. Pastor Jon talked about four areas that we need to pursuit as a faithful follower of Jesus. What were they? Which one of the four challenges you the most?
- 5. Being faithful to God requires you to choose something. What is at least one choice you can make (and follow through on) that will help you pursue faithfulness in your walk with the LORD?
- 6. What is a take-away for you from the message or this passage?
