Exploring Isaiah 12:

1. The context is the foretelling of the coming Messiah.
2. The content is about God's work of salvation through the promised Messiah.

What Has Christ Delivered us From?

1. God delivered us from His anger and brought us peace.
2. God has delivered us from fear and provides for us security.
3. God has delivered us from broken cisterns to give us satisfaction in Christ.

What has God delivered us for?

1. To make His name known in all the earth.

Discussion Questions:

1. What clues do you see in Isaiah 12:1-6 that point toward a future time when the Messiah would come?
2. Of the three things we were delivered from that pastor Jon pointed out, which one stood out to you and why?
3. Isaiah does not tell us of all the ways that God has delivered us. What other ways have we experienced deliverance in Christ that the Scriptures teach us about?
4. What are some ways you have become distracted from the joy of your salvation? What can you do about this so that you are drawing from the well of living water?
5. How does your preoccupation with the things that distract us from the joy of your salvation affect your witness?
6. What is a take-away for you from the message or this passage?
