## A Birth Announcement from God Luke 1:26-35

**Introduction:** In biblical history there were occasions where God chose to reveal the history of a life before it was conceived.

- In Luke 1 God began to intervene in history for the first time in over 400 years. He began by sending Gabriel to a priest named Zechariah (Luke :13-17)
- Then God sent Gabriel to Mary with another birth announcement (Luke 1:26-31). First Gabriel gave Mary revelation concerning a miraculous <u>conception</u>. Then Gabriel gave her revelation concerning the <u>life</u> of the child.

From Gabriel's birth announcement, note five reasons why Jesus is GREAT:

I. He is <u>GOD</u> 1:32, 35

The Hebrew name for God EL ELYON ("Most High God") speaks of God as <u>sovereign</u> over all the earth (Deut 32:8; Ps 47:2).

- 1. He is sovereign over <u>nature</u> 2 Sam 22:14-17; Lam 3:37-38
- 2. He is sovereign over the <u>unrighteous</u> Ps 7:6-9, 17; 9:2, 7
- 3. He is sovereign over the <u>righteous</u> Ps 21:7

Jesus Christ is the son of the MOST HIGH GOD – He bears the same <u>essence</u> as God (Luke 1:35; Heb 1:3).

- Elizabeth declared His deity (Luke 1:43)
- > The angel that appeared to <u>Joseph</u> declared His deity (Mt 1:23)
- > Angels declared His deity to the <u>shepherds</u> (Luke 2:11).
- <u>Christ</u> claimed to be God (John 10:30; 14:9).

## II. He is <u>MAN</u> 1:31, 34-35; 2:6-7

The miracle was in the <u>conception</u>. The <u>Holy Spirit</u> did the miracle of fertilizing an egg in Mary's womb without a man.

Jesus Christ is fully <u>God</u> and fully <u>man</u>! As a result, He is our <u>substitute</u> and our <u>sympathetic</u> High Priest (2 Tim 2:5; Heb 2:17-18).

## IV. He is LORD and someday will reign as KING 1:32-33; Rev 19:11-16

Jesus is the "Christ" – the <u>anointed</u> king. He is ruling over a <u>spiritual</u> today of those who are His – and one day He will reign over an <u>earthly</u> kingdom.

## V. He is <u>SAVIOR</u> 1:31; 20:28; Luke 2:28-32; 19:10; 1 Tim 1:15; 1 John 4:14

"Jesus" means, "Jehovah who <u>saves</u> (Mat 1:20-21)." We can admire Jesus as God, man, holy and Lord – but we can only <u>know</u> Him as Savior!

Study Questions:

1. Why is the truth of the virgin conception/birth of Christ critical to our faith in light of the following Scriptures?

Genesis 3:15; Isaiah 7:14 – how does it give credibility to the Bible?

Romans 5:12 – why was it important that Jesus NOT be conceived through a human father?

- 2. How does the truth that Jesus is fully man impact His present role as our High Priest interceding for us in heaven? What are human experiences that Jesus suffered as a man that enables Him to sympathize with us (physically, emotionally, spiritually)?
- 3. What is the significance of the holiness of Jesus when it comes to our salvation? See Exodus 12:5; John 1:29; 1 Corinthians 5:7; 2 Corinthians 5:21.
- 4. Read 1 John 4:1-3. Can a person be saved if they deny that Jesus is fully God and fully man? How do Mormons, Jehovah's witnesses and Muslims contradict the Bible's teaching about Christ?
- 5. From our study of the five ways in which Jesus is "great" which causes you the greatest sense of amazement and wonder?
