### The Despised Jesus

**Introduction:** We celebrate Christmas because we understand the <u>significance</u> of the event (Luke 2:11; 1 John 4:14). We celebrate Christmas because it is a <u>joyful</u> event. But there is a profound <u>sadness</u> that pervades the Christmas story. It is a partial <u>fulfillment</u> of Isaiah's prophecy (Isaiah 53:3; Mat 11:29; Phil 2:5-8).

Jesus grew up despised from His own people and family.

## I. Jesus' Rejection

1. At His birth – Mary's **Shame** (Luke 1:26-38; John 8:41)

Though Mary is highly favored by God, the gospels suggest that she became an <u>outcast</u> of her family. When Mary was impregnated by the Holy Spirit, it is possible that her family could not believe her story. She may have been shunned by her family and forced to leave.

- ➤ That would explain her visit to Elizabeth (Luke 1:39-45)
- Note that Gabriel appeared to Joseph but there is no indication that he appeared to any of Mary's family members.
- That would also explain why Mary would make the trip to Bethlehem with Joseph while being nine months pregnant.
- ➤ It would also explain why they would be shunned by family when they arrived in Bethlehem (Luke 2:6-7).
  - Note the word for "inn" in Luke 2:7 is KATALUNA. In many homes it was a <u>guest</u> room for traveling friends and family members. Perhaps the reason Mary gave birth in the stable was because word had spread about the <u>shame</u> Mary brought to the family.

# 2. His earthly ministry (Luke 2:34-35; Rom 9:31-32)

- 1) He was rejected by His hometown of Nazareth (Luke 4:16-30)
- 2) He was rejected by His immediate <u>family</u> (Mark 3:21; 31-35; John 7:5; 1 Cor 15:7; Acts 1:14)
- 3) He was mocked by His own people (John 8:48)
- 3. The Cross (Mt 27:39-44; Mark 15:19-20)

#### II. God's Vindication

1. God vindicated Mary (Luke 1:46-49)

Mary viewed herself as God's <u>servant</u> - fully committed to doing the will of God even thought it meant being shamed and shunned and watching her son's rejection and humiliation.

## 2. God vindicated <u>Jesus</u> (Phil 2:9-11)

**Conclusion:** If there is ever a reason to fall down before Jesus Christ and acknowledge Him as Savior and Lord and worship at His feet, it is after we have grasped the total <u>humiliation</u> and <u>rejection</u> that Jesus experienced at His birth, throughout His life and in His crucifixion.

- ➤ Because Jesus was willing to be despised and rejected by MEN...WE are now <u>accepted</u> into His family (John 1:11-12)
- ➤ Because of His HUMILIATION, we will share in His <u>GLORIFICATION</u> (2 Thess 1:10; 2 Tim 2:11-12; Rom 8:17-18)

Study Questions for the message, "The Despised Jesus."

1. Share some "humiliating" experiences you've had in your life. How do those kinds of experiences shape our perspective of being "lowly"? Note how Paul uses the incarnation of Christ to call us to humility in Philippians 2:3-5.

How does our study today affect your perspective on humility and "lowliness?"

- 2. How did the study today affect your perspective of Mary & Joseph? What can we learn from them about surrender to the will of God when it comes with a cost?
- 3. Jesus grew up the same way any human grows up in a home and community (Luke 2:52). The difference was that Jesus NEVER SINNED. So how could His brothers and people from Nazareth be so blind to His claim to be the Son of God and Savior of men? And how does that apply to people today who hear the gospel every Christmas and Easter and yet are unaffected by it? See 2 Cor 4:3-6
- 4. How does the humiliation and glorification of Jesus impact our own testimony and stand in the world? Note from John 15:18-26 reasons WHY THE WORLD HATES CHRISTIANS.
