### The Feast of Trumpets

1. The feast involved the **blasting** of trumpets.
2. The feast announced the **end** of the harvest season.
3. The feast involved **offerings** made to God. (Numbers 29:1-6)
4. The feast is connected to **rest**.

### The Prophetic Significance of the Feast of Trumpets

1. The feast of trumpets foreshadows the **coming** of King Jesus.

### The Relevance of this Feast

1. It reminds us that there is a time when the harvest of souls is **finished**.
2. It reminds us that Jesus will return as the Lion of Judah to **judge** to earth.
3. It reminds us that God's redemptive actions in history will lead eventually to **rest** at the end of the harvest for His people.

**Discussion Questions:**

1. Read Matthew 13:24-30; 36-43. How does the explanation of this parable help you understand the Biblical meaning of harvest in God’s redemptive story?
2. Read Matthew 9:35-38. What does Jesus’ use of harvest teach us in this parable?
3. The church is in the harvest season of redemptive history. What are the implications of that reality for us?
4. In what ways can we stay on mission during this harvest season?
5. What action are you going to take as a result of what God’s Word teaches?
