

Point 1: Practicing the 'Politics of Jesus' to the Powers-That-Be (v. 1-2)

Point 2: What We Were (and Need to Leave Behind)—Lives Run by Selfishness (v. 3)

Point 3: What We've Become (and Need to Keep Becoming)—Reborn, Renewed, Ready for Anything (v. 4-7)

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Why do you think Paul put the command to obey authorities and to be ready to do good right after the injunction at the end of Ch. 2 "Do not let anyone despise you"? What could we learn from that command as it relates to our lives in the public sphere?
- 2. How might displays of goodness, refusal to slander, peaceableness, consideration, and humility (vv.1b-2) towards the powers-that-be have a redemptive effect, and make the reality of the Gospel more attractive?
- 3. What connects together all the negative characteristics that used to define us (v. 3 gives a whole list)? What is the fundamental motive for the natural man, as revealed here?
- 4. Try to enumerate all the things Christ has done to us and for us, based on the list in vv. 4-7—how is He shaping and transforming us?
- 5. The notion of the "hope of eternal life," mentioned at the end of v. 7, has been a recurrent theme in Paul's letter to Titus to get him ready to minister in Crete—what are the implications of this hope in our lives today, this week, this coming year?
