Text: Matthew 28:18-20

Big Idea: Jesus' Main Essential Mission for His Church is Making Disciples for His Glory.

Discussion Questions:

1. What is a disciple? Try starting with the simplest definition possible and then adding more of an expansive definition of an ideal disciple from Scripture.
2. How does a person become a disciple of Jesus? (How do they begin the road of discipleship?)
3. What is the “end goal” of discipleship?
4. What difference does Jesus’ authority (vs. 18) and presence (vs. 20) make to how and why we make disciples?
5. Is there a “silver bullet” for making disciples well? Explain.
6. Has the mission of the church changed since Matthew 28? Explain.
7. How should we think about the various ministries, activities, and programs of the church in relation to the main mission?
8. In what ways can a church “drift” from focus and faithfulness on Jesus’ mission? How can we make sure that doesn’t happen at FBC?
9. How specifically can you be involved in the “disciple-making” process this week?
