Prayer Orients Our Heart Toward the Character of God

1. He is our *intimate* Father.

Relevance: It reminds you that you are loved.

2. He is transcendent and **sovereign**.

Relevance: It reminds you that God is in control.

3. He is holy.

Relevance: It reminds us that God is God.

Where Do I Start?

- 1. Quiet your heart and consider whom you are addressing.
- 2. Pray in conjunction with your daily reading.
- 3. Keep a running list of the **<u>characteristics</u>** of God to use them in your prayer time.

- 2. What are some of the difficulties we face when trying to orient our hearts around God's character through prayer?
- 3. What are some practical ways you can help quiet your heart and orient it around God's character in prayer?
- 4. What does Psalm 139 reveal about God? Make a list and address God in prayer by using one or two of those characteristics. Allow that characteristic of God to lead the rest of your prayer.
- 5. What was your biggest take-a-way from the message this morning?

Discipleship Tip:
