Questions that Need Answered

- 1. If God has forgiven my sin in the past, present, and future, then why do I need to confess my sin to Him and ask for forgiveness?
 - a. Answer 1: Because we still sin.
 - b. Answer #2: Because our present **sin** affects our present **walk** with God.
 - c. Answer #3: Because daily confession makes us **sensitive** to our own sin.
 - d. Answer #4: Because daily confession of sin keeps us **humble** before God.
- 2. Why is there a connection between our willingness to forgive others and God's forgiveness of our own sin?
 - a. Answer #1: An unforgiving person demonstrates a **blindness** towards their own sin debt that was put on the Savior.
 - b. Answer #2: A heart of unforgiveness is sure indicator of an unrepentant heart.
- 3. How does this part of the Lord's Prayer help me?
 - a. It orients our heart toward God's amazing mercy!
 - b. It orients our heart toward becoming a **mercy** filled person!
