Paul Answers Three Objections

- 1. Objection #1: "Paul, what you are teaching renders our Jewish heritage meaningless!"
 - **a.** Paul's Answer: Just because your Jewish heritage does not keep you from God's wrath, doesn't mean that it has no value.
- 2. Objection #2: "Paul, God would be <u>unfaithful</u> if He held us accountable for the faithlessness of a few "
 - a. Paul's Answer: The issue is not God's faithfulness, but rather your <u>blindness</u> to your own unfaithfulness.
- **3. Objection #3:** "Paul, God can't hold us accountable for violating His law because they serve to **magnify** God."
 - **a. Paul's First Answer:** God can use the violation of His law as the <u>magnification</u> of His righteousness and the <u>basis</u> of His judgment.
 - **b. Paul's Second Answer:** By that argument, there is no way you can believe I am telling a lie and still **condemn** me as a sinner.
 - **c.** Paul's Third Answer: Your objection only proves you <u>deserve</u> condemnation.

False Saviors

- 1. Your Christian **upbringing** does not exempt you from condemnation.
- 2. Your **religious** activity does not exempt you from condemnation.
- 3. Your reliance on cheap **grace** will not exempt you from condemnation.

The Big Take-a-Way: Only being "IN <u>CHRIST</u>" will exempt you from condemnation!

Questions to reflect upon:

- 1. Why do you think it would have been shocking for Paul to say that a true Jew is one inwardly not outwardly, and in this way, Gentiles can actually be true Jews?
- 2. Paul's argument is that all people are under God's wrath, including the Jews, who seem to claim special privilege before God, after all they are His chosen people, people of the covenant, and have been given the law. However, on what basis were they equal to the Gentiles?
- 3. In what ways do we have a tendency to assume special privilege before God?
- 4. Out of the three false saviors that Pastor Jon mentioned, which ones do you think is most prominent in today's church?
- 5. How is God speaking to you through Romans and how should you respond?

Questions to reflect upon (older kid's version):

- 1. What were the three objections that Paul answered?
- 2. How did Paul answer those objections?
- 3. Which answer that Paul gave stood out to you the most and why?
- 4. What false savior stood out to you the most and why?
- 5. How does it make you feel that there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus?
