

3 Observations about Worship! (Romans 12:1-2)

- 1. Worship is a response to God and His great **mercy** toward us.
- 2. Worship is most authentically expressed through our <u>lives</u> not our lips.
 - a. We pursue a life **set apart** for God.
 - b. We pursue a life that is **pleasing** to God.
- 3. We worship God as people who are being transformed.
 - a. This means we are not **perfect** but pursue the One who is perfect.
 - b. Transformation involves **deconstructing** worldly thought patterns.

c. Transformation involves **constructing** thought patterns rooted in truth.

Questions to Ask Yourself

- 1. How much have I really thought about the depth of God's mercy towards me?
- 2. Am I willing to offer myself completely to God as a living sacrifice?
- 3. Am I being more conformed by this world than by the truth of Scripture?
- 4. In what ways has the world influenced my own thinking?
- 5. What is one step I can take immediately to be a living offering to God that is set-apart and pleasing to Him?
