What Does God Say About Submission to Authority? (Romans 13:1-7)

- 1. The clear **command** in this passage is for believers to submit to governing authorities.
- 2. There are 2 **reasons** behind the command to submit to governing authorities.
 - a. Governing authorities are actually God's design.
 - b. All governing authorities are **established** by God.
- 3. The implication is that to resist authority is to go <u>against</u> God's design, which brings about <u>judgment</u>.

Is there any cases in which submission to authority is permitted?

- 1. It is permitted in the case when authorities are telling you **to do** what God has told you **not to do**.
- 2. It is permitted in the case when authorities are telling you **not to do** what God has told you **to do**.

What shall we conclude?

- 1. As believers, we should submit to our government because it is the **right** thing to do.
- 2. Believers need to weigh very carefully what circumstances we try to **justify** for resisting governmental authority, because it is not a light matter to God.
- 3. Unjustified resistance will have devastating effects.
 - a. Divine **Judgment**
 - b. Human **Punishment**
 - c. Gospel **Disillusionment**
- 4. Submission to authority doesn't mean that you have no **voice**, it means you exercise your voice from a position of submission.

- 2. Can you think of good reasons to be resistant to governing authorities that you support from the Scriptures?
- 3. Can you think of bad reasons to be resistant to governing authorities?
