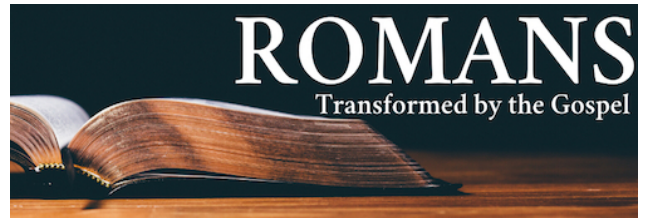


The Incomprehensible Wisdom of God!

God's Plan for Israel (Romans 11:1-36)

1. Israel's falling away was only **partial**. (Romans 11:1-10)
2. Israel's falling away had **purpose** in God's redemptive plan! (Romans 11:11-24)
3. Israel's falling away will not be **permanent**! (Romans 11:25-32)

Responding to God's Wisdom and Ways (Romans 11:33-36)

1. Be in **awe** of God's riches, wisdom and knowledge!
2. Trust that God knows what He is **doing**, especially when you don't!
3. Trust that all things work towards God's **glory**.

2. How does chapter 11 inform your own understanding of and heart for Israel?
3. What does chapter 11 teach about the wisdom and ways of God?
4. Why can we trust God in all things?

November Scripture Memory:

20 For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. 21 But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. 22 But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit you get leads to sanctification and its end, eternal life. 23 For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.
