Note that although Christ died for ALL MEN, that does not mean that ALL MEN will be saved. Though His death on the cross was _____ for the salvation of all men, it is _____ (“effective”) only to those who call upon His name for salvation.

This was all a part of God’s salvation plan that was “given at the proper time.” Redemption was God’s plan from eternity past, but was carried out in time by Christ on the cross.
