Philippians 3:1-11

**Big Idea:** When I give up the rubbish of my own self-righteousness, I can freely receive the righteousness of Christ by faith and relationship with Christ for eternity.

	repeats himself throughout the book of Philippians?

- 2. What are some big truths from Scripture that we should repeat often to ourselves?
- 3. In this passage, Paul is blunt and harsh towards the Judaizers and their teaching. This echoes Jesus' similar bluntness with the Pharisees (See Matthew 23:1-36). Why do you think they were so direct and condemnatory toward these teachers?
- 4. What are some ways that we can fall into the mindset of self-righteous religion?
- 5. What is so dangerous about self-righteous religion?
- 6. How would you explain Christ's righteousness and how to receive it?
- 7. What makes Christ's righteousness so valuable?
- 8. Have you ever found yourself slipping back into the mindset of self-righteous religion? How can we guard against this?
