Genesis 1:1-25

Big Idea: On page 1 of God's Story, we find a Good Creator who inspires awe, who deserves praise, and who calls us to pay attention to the pages ahead.

Outline:

1. God is the Great Creator of Everything

Response: Awe-Inspired Bowed Knees to Him

2. God is the Good Designer of His Domain

Response: Praising Raised Hands to Him

3. God is the Personal Preeminent Author of His Story

Response: Listening Ears Turned to Him

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What attribute of God most stands out to you from Genesis 1?
- 2. Is there anything in Genesis 1 that challenges or stretches your current understanding of God?
- 3. How does the God of Genesis 1 differ from the idols of man's imagination?
- 4. How does Genesis 1 showcase both God's "greatness" and "goodness." Why are both of these aspects of God's character important?
- 5. What do we learn that is important about the created world from Genesis 1?
- 6. Should we interpret Genesis 1's days "literally" or as part of a "figurative literary framework"? ...and what are the implications for each of these interpretative decisions on:
 - a. The age of the earth?
 - b. The compatibility of the Bible with "science"?
 - c. The reliability and authority of Scripture?
 - d. The gospel of Jesus?
- 7. How does the God of Genesis 1 differ from the god of Deism?
- 8. What is your *response* to Genesis 1? In other words, how can we appropriately *apply* this passage? (for inspiration see Psalm 8:1-4, 136:1-9)
