What Is the Gospel?

1. The Gospel is a message of God's gracious work of redemption through His Son, Jesus Christ.
 - a. Bad News: Every person is a sinner by nature and choice and therefore are separated from a Holy God and stand condemned.
 - b. Good News: God graciously sent His Son, Jesus, into the world to break sin's curse by making payment for our sin upon a cross and rising from the dead, thus making peace between man and God possible and giving eternal life to those who repent of their sin and believe in the person and work of Jesus Christ.
2. The Gospel has the power to rescue the soul from death.
 - a. It is a message that followers of Jesus believe.
 - i. Faith and repentance are inseparable.
3. The Gospel realigns our lives so that we reflect the Glory of Christ to those around us.
 - a. It is a message that followers of Jesus embody.

2. What is the difference between seeing the Gospel as transactional as opposed to being transformational?
3. The New Testament often uses language that points the reader to look at the sufferings and death of Jesus. Why is this so critical for the Christian to do?
4. What values did Jesus Christ demonstrate through His death? How can those values help you realign your own attitude or actions?
5. What was your biggest take-a-way from the message this morning?
